## Existing Approvals:

**PD 98-1513** rezoned the property in 1998 from PD (Planned Development) and RSC-6 (Residential, Single Family Conventional) to PD (Planned Development). The site was approved for a mixed use of development consisting of single family, multifamily, office and commercial. The area subject to the current minor modification is located within the 73.9-acre Town Center which allows up to 225 dwelling units with a maximum residential density of 20 dwellings per acre and subject to RMC-20 zoning district development standards. The Town Center also permits up to 260,000-square-feet commercial and a maximum of 40,000-square-feet office uses.

The most recent amendment was PRS 13-0591. The subject site is also located within DRI #241 (Harbor Bay DRI) which encompasses approximately 1,096 acres. The applicant is not proposing any changes to the DRI. The subject area is located wholly within the 73.9-acre designated Town Center which includes commercial, office, residential and recreational uses.

**Proposed PRS 25-0426** requests to amend the existing Conditions of Approval with similar standards utilized for other detached single-family residential development PODs within the Harbour Bay PD. The applicant proposes to amend Condition 9 of the Conditions of Approval via proposed condition No. 9.2 establishing a new category of Florida Traditional Development ("FTD") standards applicable only to the subject property that would allow for a single-family detached product to be constructed on the existing platted lots within the FTD community, in lieu of townhomes.

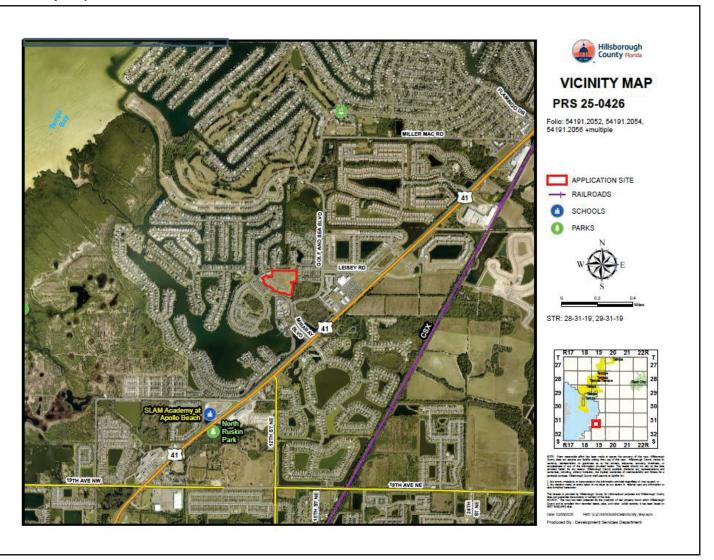

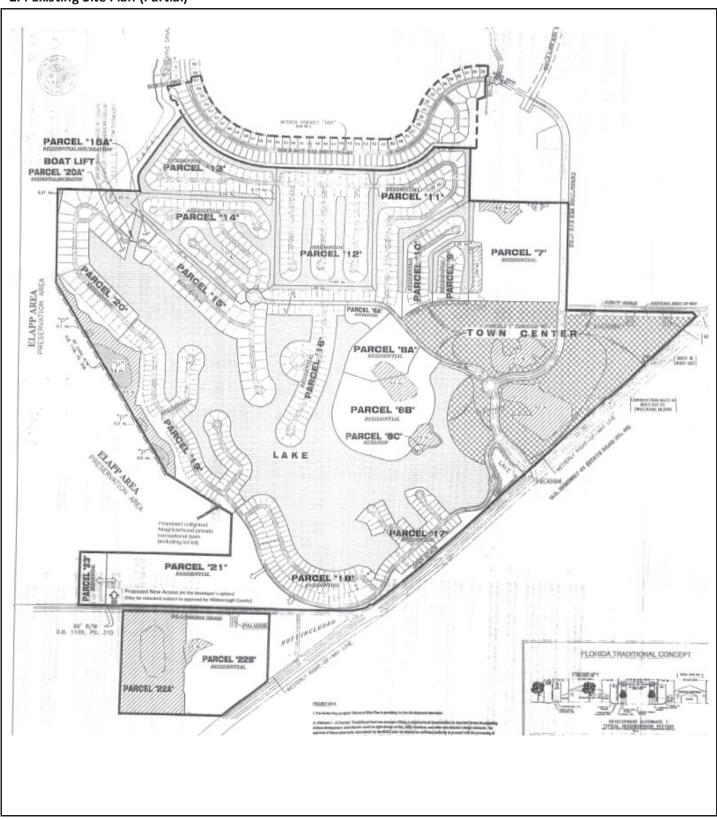

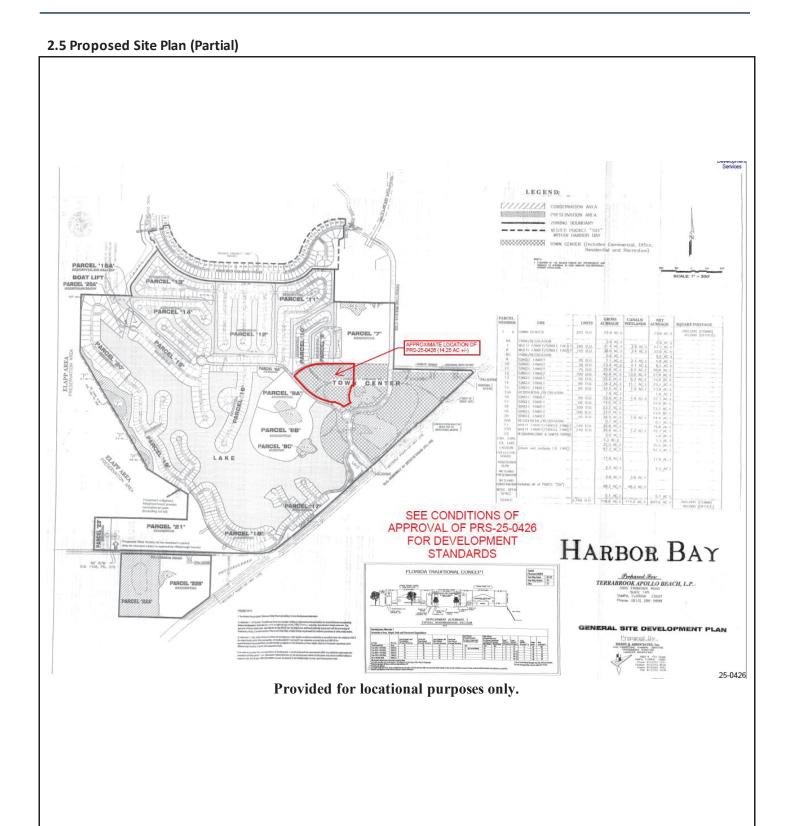

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## 5.1 Compatibility

The area within the Planned Development subject to this request is generally located on the north side of the Mirabay Boulevard and Golf and Sea Boulevard. The subject property was platted as "Townhomes at Compass Pointe" on May 9, 2006, Plat Book 108, Pages 217 through 228. The Applicant is seeking to amend the existing Conditions of Approval to establish single-family detached development standards that will allow for a single-family detached product to be constructed on the existing platted lots. This includes modifying PD 98-1513 to include additional minimum setbacks and development standards for detached single-family homes on the subject platted lots. To the immediate east, also located within the Town Center is developed with duplexes extending eastward to Golf and Sea Boulevard. Southwest across Mirabay Boulevard is a single-family residential neighborhood developed in the Florida Traditional Development, Alternate 1, Option 1 per Mirabay Parcel 8 plat.

According to the applicant's narrative, "The Subject Property is currently platted in a configuration consistent with the Construction Plan approvals (Project Identification No. 6308) for a planned townhome development. These Construction Plans appear to have been reviewed and approved under the FTD design criteria (Option 2) for townhomes. The Applicant's proposed amendment would establish single-family detached development standards that will allow for a single-family detached product to be constructed on the existing platted lots by modifying the FTD criteria for that use." The name of the approved plat for the subject site is "Townhomes as Compass Pointe".

The subject property is located within the "Town Center" portion of PD 98-1513 (PRS 13-0591). The Town Center allows commercial, office, multi-family and single-family residential development. There are two residential development options. The first type of development allows residential and/or non-residential development with uses and development standards of the RSC-6, RMC-20, B-PO, and/or C-G zoning district standards. The second type of development allows an alternative development pattern known as "Florida Traditional Development" (FTD), with a table labeled "Development Alternative 1—Typical Neighborhood Section" set forth on face of the General Site Plan identifying required development standards including setbacks and lot sizes, for both townhome and detached single-family residential development. The FTD criteria are further clarified by Conditions 9 through 15. The applicant proposes to modify Condition No. 9 adding proposed Condition No. 9.2 to allow a second set of Florida Traditional Development standards limited to the parcels located within the "Townhomes at Compass Pointe" plat for detached single-family residential development. The proposed change will neither increase the number of units currently approved nor change the number of existing platted lots within the approved plat.

Pursuant to nearby residents' concerns, the applicant agreed to additional conditions which address several concerns. Specifically, the proposed conditions prohibit "on-street" parking along or within alleyways or the driveways serving individual units which are accessed via alleyways; prohibits fencing, rocks, walls, or similar materials within the 5-foot rear and side yard setbacks that are adjacent to the alleyways, permitting only grass and other frangible landscaping materials within the area; requires sidewalks to occur on the side of the structures without alleyways due to pedestrian safety concerns between garages, sidewalks and pedestrians.

The applicant has not requested variations from the general site development requirements found in Parts 6.05.00, Parking and Loading; 6.06.00, Landscaping, Irrigation and Buffering Requirements; or 6.07.00, Fences and Walls of the Land Development Code. The application does not request any variations to the Hillsborough County Land Development Code, nor any changes to the existing site plan.

#### 5.2 Recommendation

Based upon the above considerations, staff finds the request is APPROVABLE, subject to conditions

#### **6.0 PROPOSED CONDITIONS**

Staff finds the request Approvable, subject to the following conditions listed below, and based on the general site plan submitted April 25, 2025.

- 1. The development of the project shall proceed in strict accordance with the terms and conditions contained in the Development Order for the DRI, the Site Plan, the zoning conditions contained herein, and all applicable rules, regulations and ordinances of Hillsborough County.
- 2. The maximum amount of each development type shall be as indicated on the Certified General Site Development Plan.
- 3. Each parcel within the site is permitted two development scenarios with the following permitted uses except as further conditioned elsewhere in these zoning conditions:
  - 3.1 Development of each of the parcels in a conventional parcel development configuration with conventional standards, buffers and screening as specified on the general site plan; OR,
  - 3.2 Development of each of the parcels in a Florida Traditional Development concept (FTD) configuration with uses as depicted on the general site plan and standards as specified in Alternate # 1 on the above referenced site plan, except as amended below.
- 4. Upon construction of a residential dwelling unit in a development parcel, a precedent is established for such parcel for either conventional parcel development or TND development and, therefore, only that type of development may be constructed in that development parcel. However, the developer shall have the option of modifying the size and dimensions of each pod including further pod division prior to approval of construction site plans. The developer shall be required to amend the certified general site plan to reflect modifications in pod sizes and dimensions. The developer shall be responsible for preparing and enforcing the parcels architectural control guidelines.

# THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY IF THE PROJECT IS DEVELOPED IN A CONVENTIONAL POD DEVELOPMENT

- 5. Land uses, setbacks, and other development standards within parcels designated "Town Center" (parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6) shall be restricted to those permitted within the C-G and B-PO and RMC-20 zoning district. The maximum FAR shall be 0.25. The maximum residential density shall be 20 dwelling units per acre.
- 6. Land uses, setbacks, and other development standards within parcels designated for multi-family shall be restricted to those permitted within the RMC-20 zoning district. The maximum density shall be 20 dwelling units per gross acre.
- 7. Land uses, setbacks, and other development standards within parcels designated single-family residential shall be restricted to those permitted within the RSC-9 zoning district. (With the exception of an allowable 15' front and 8' rear setbacks on canal lots). The maximum density shall be 9 dwelling units per gross acre.
- 8. External access points shall be as indicated on the approved general site plan, subject to final approval by Hillsborough County and the Florida Department of Transportation.
  - 8.1 The conceptually located access proposed via Villemaire into parcel 21 is at the developer's option and if constructed, will be gated by a card reader or other device to control unauthorized access. The gate system is subject to review and approval by all applicable Hillsborough County emergency providers.

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8.2 All internal subdivision roads shall be maintained by the home owner association, the Community Development District, or a similar entity and shall not be the responsibility of the County.

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY IF THE PROJECT IS DEVELOPED IN A FLORIDA TRADITIONAL DEVELOPMENT (FTD).

- 9. Setbacks and other development standards for specific uses within each of the parcels shall be as indicated in Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan as attached, except as amended below.
  - 9.1 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received February 90, 2005 for PRS 05-0710, the minimum Front Yard setback for front-loading garages shall be 20 feet; and the minimum Front Yard setback for side—loading garages (garages in which the garage entrance does not face the street entrance to the lot) shall be 15 feet.
  - 9.2 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received April 17, 2025, for PRS 25-0426 which has been platted consistent with the Florida Traditional Development option for the Town Center, pursuant to that certain Plat of Townhomes at Compass Pointe recorded at Official Records Book 108, Page 217, (referred to as "Compass Point Plat"). Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan is amended to additionally include the following minimum setbacks and other development standards when developing single family detached uses on the subject platted lots:

- <sup>1</sup> Porch Steps / Stairs may be located within the front setback.
- <sup>2</sup> Where adjacent to an alleyway, the setback shall be measured from the edge of alley pavement to face of the façade. Alley pavement shall be a minimum of 18 feet in width.
- 3. Where adjacent to an alleyway, the setback located adjacent to an alleyway (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat), only the following landscaping and improvements shall be installed (a) a grass strip and/or frangible landscaping materials less than 18-inches in height (e.g. no plantings over 18-inches tall, nor fences, walls, hedges, trees, or rocks shall be permitted within these areas), and (b) a driveway providing access to/from the home and the alleyway.
- 9.2.1 Model Homes constructed in Block 105 may utilize the existing on-street parking spaces located on Anchor Line Drive to satisfy employee and visitor parking requirements per Sec. 6.11.62, Land Development Code.
- 9.2.2 Parking (temporary or otherwise) shall not be permitted in the following locations:
  - a. Along the alleyways (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat); and
  - b. Within any individual driveway which serves a dwelling unit accessed via such

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alleyways (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat), where such driveway (measured from edge of alley pavement to face of façade) is less than 20 feet in length.

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This condition shall not be construed as preventing the loading and unloading of vehicles within the notification area.

- 9.2.3 Streets and alleyways within the modification area shall be perpetually owned and maintained by a Homeowners Association or similar maintenance entity (i.e. no transfer of ownership or maintenance responsibility may be transferred to Hillsborough County) consistent with the Compass Point Plat and community governance documents.
- 9.2.4 Each dwelling unit shall have pedestrian access via a continuous sidewalk system which connects each unit to the sidewalk system along a roadway or common area within or adjacent to the modification area. Such sidewalk system may be gated; however, if gated such gates shall be available for the daily use of project residents and guests. Such pedestrian sidewalk system shall be within a tract owned and maintained by a Homeowners Association or similar maintenance entity. Alternatively, where the pedestrian sidewalk system runs through an adjacent lot or lots, each lot owner shall be granted access easement(s) as necessary to ensure that each owner has access to the sidewalk system. All easements shall be recorded prior or concurrent with site/construction plan approval, or, if no such approval is necessary, prior to issuance of Certificates of Occupancy (temporary or otherwise) for each individual unit.
  - a. <u>Dwellings located adjacent to the sidewalk system shall have an entrance with a sidewalk from</u> the dwellings to the sidewalk system.
  - b. There shall be no sidewalks along the alleyway.
  - c. Yards fronting the sidewalk system shall be considered front yards. Yards facing alleyways shall be considered rear yards. Yards with two sides fronting an alleyway shall adhere to the same requirements as a rear yard facing an alleyway.
- 9.2.5 In accordance with LDC Section 5.03.07.C, the certified PD general site plan for the area within PRS 25-0426 shall expire for the internal transportation network and external access points, as well as for any conditions related to the internal transportation network and external access points, if site construction plans, or equivalent thereof, have not been approved for all or part of the subject Planned Development within 5 years of the effective date of the PD unless an extension is granted as provided in the LDC. Upon expiration, re-certification of the PD General Site Plan shall be required in accordance with provisions set forth in LDC Section 5.03.07.C.
- 10. Each owner occupied dwelling unit is permitted one detached accessory dwelling unit on the same lot with standards as defined and regulated by the LDC. Because of their accessory nature, these units shall not be deducted from the overall number of units permitted for the project.
- 11. Sidewalks, a minimum of 4 feet wide, shall be required on both sides of the street.
- 12. Alleyways shall be permitted.
- 13. Land uses within the parcels designated "Town Center" (Parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6) shall be permitted to mix retail, office, recreational and residential uses as permitted within the C-G, B-PO, and RMC-20 zoning districts. Churches and other religious institutions, Child Care facilities, Adult Care facilities, Community meeting facilities, Community Residential Homes type A, B, and C, and individual craft or rural home industries employing no more than 5 employees each shall also be permitted without additional special use review. For purposes of determining size and bulk, the maximum FAR of the non-residential portion of any structure shall be 0.25 and the residential portion shall have a density of 20 dwellings per acre.

- 14. Land uses within parcels designated "Town Center" shall be of a unified design scheme exhibiting the following design criteria:
  - 14.1 Interconnected pedestrian system with the surrounding project.
  - 14.2 Provision of pedestrian facilities (i.e.: shade trees, tables, chairs, benches, trash receptacles).
  - 14.3 Other amenities including awnings and other outdoor overhead structures providing shade, public art, water features and drinking fountains.
  - 14.4 On-street parking is encouraged.
  - 14.5 There shall be no front yard setback.
  - 14.6 To the greatest extent possible, other than on-street parking, all additional parking shall be located in the rear yard of all structures.
  - 14.7 A mix of residential and non-residential development within the same structure is encouraged.
- 15. On street parking shall be permitted within each of the parcels and shall count as part of any required parking. The developer shall have the right to submit alternative parking plans and shared parking plans to satisfy required parking. Excessive parking spaces shall be discouraged.

#### THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY REGARDLESS OF WHICH OPTION IS CHOSEN

- 16. Public and private recreational uses and public assembly uses including meeting halls, club houses, religious institutions, child day care centers, and lighted tot lots, ball fields and courts are specifically approved in any parcel designated for Town Center.
- 17. Private recreational uses shall be permitted within parcels 15 and 20 where adjacent to the boat lift and within parcel 8 at the location as indicated on the certified general site plan. Accessory pedestrian, bicycle, canoe, wind surfing, paddle boats, fishing, and nature walk facilities including restrooms and showers, bike racks, interpretive kiosks, snack bars, bait stands, and information centers, and necessary vehicular parking to serve such uses shall also be permitted within these areas. The location and size of such accessory facilities including the exact dimensions of recreational facility parcels shall be determined at Preliminary Plat or Site Plan approval for that parcel, with the exception that any proposed building shall be limited to a maximum of 600 square feet, and any related rental storage shall be limited to a height of 15 feet. No more than one facility shall be permitted on each parcel.
- 18. General office and permissible commercial uses shall be concentrated for maximum pedestrian convenience and located for easy accessibility by residents and workers.
- 19. The developer shall designate the "Preserve" protection area in accordance with the requirements contained within the companion DRI Development Order.
- 20. Boat, RV, camper trailers (but not mobile homes) and other similar uses shall be considered ancillary uses to a residential land use. The open storage of boats, RV's and similar uses owned by the residents of the project is specifically permitted in parcel 23 provided this facility is completely screened from view by either a masonry wall or opaque fence six feet in height and adequately maintained by the developer or its assigns. If such group can no longer or is unwilling to assume maintenance responsibilities, the private open storage area may be redeveloped with uses and lots similar to the adjacent residential development pattern provided there is no additional residential units beyond those previously approved.

21. Boat lifts, in accordance with and in the general location as indicated on the general site plan shall be permitted subject to approval by all applicable agencies. Approval of this zoning petition in no way warrants approval of the boat lift or resultant boat traffic by other agencies.

- 22. The large interior lake (AKA Lagoon), in accordance with and in the general location as indicated on the general site plan submitted on September 8, 2000 shall be permitted subject to approval by all applicable agencies. Approval of this zoning petition in no way warrants approval of the size, dimensions, or use of the lagoon or potential boat traffic by other agencies.
- 23. A sales center shall be permitted in any parcel designated for Town Center (parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6).
- 24. Accessory structures not limited to decks, docks, pools and patios shall be allowed with a 3' side and rear setback, except canal lots which shall have a 0' rear yard setback.
- 25. Single family uses may be permitted within any multi-family parcel to the extent that the total number of units do not exceed the maximum permitted by the DRI.
- An interim agricultural use of cattle grazing, citrus groves, and other low scale agricultural uses shall be permitted. This agricultural operation shall not result in the destruction of the natural plant community vegetation on the property. Any application to conduct land alteration activities on the property must be submitted to the Natural Resources Team of the Planning and Growth Management Department for review and approval. Use of the agricultural exemption provision to the Land Alteration regulations is prohibited.
- 27. The developer shall prepare and submit a sea grass protection plan including all related local commitments to the Hillsborough County Environmental Protection Commission as part of required local approvals and environmental permitting.
- 28. The developer may provide parks in the locations as generally depicted on the approved General Development Site Plan and/or within any parcel designated for Town Center (Parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6). These parks shall be maintained and be the perpetual responsibility of the developer or subsequent homeowner group or other similar association. If neither group can no longer or is unwilling to assume maintenance responsibilities, the park(s) may be redeveloped with uses and lots similar to the adjacent residential development pattern provided there are no additional residential units beyond those previously approved.
- 29. To promote connectivity and to ensure completion of the extension of Golf and Sea Boulevard, the developer shall use best efforts with the assistance and support of Hillsborough County to design and commence construction to county standards, and dedicate to the county the applicable Golf and Sea Boulevard extension prior to or commensurate with 400 dwelling units of residential development. The completion of this segment shall occur within one year of the commencement date. No additional permits shall be issued after the completion date without completion of the road.
- 30. The developer shall be permitted to transfer dwelling units between parcels designated for such use subject to no increase in the overall number of units approved for the project. The developer shall be required to submit a revised general site plan for certification to reflect any change/transfer in dwelling units between pods.
- 31. As part of any approval of Parcel 22, the developer shall provide an acceptable access via Villemaire Road to the project for Sheriff and Fire Departments access for purposes of safety, and for the County Parks Dept for purposes of maintenance of adjacent County owned ELAP lands.
- 32. Prior to Preliminary site plan approval for parcel (Parcel 22), the developer shall provide a traffic analysis signed by a Professional Engineer, showing the length of the left turn lane required to serve the project's traffic. The developer shall construct, at their expense, a westbound left turn lane at the projects driveway. The improvement

shall be constructed to Hillsborough County standards.

- 33. Prior to issuance of Certificates of Occupancy for development with Development Parcels 1 through 6:
  - 33.1 The applicant shall be required to construct right turn lanes at each project driveway on US Highway 41 and a left turn lane at the directional median southern access on US Highway 41.
  - 33.2 The applicant shall be required to dedicate additional right of way for the future road widening as determined by FDOT. Additional right of way may also be required to construct the right turn lanes on US Highway 41 as also determined by FDOT.
  - The applicant shall be required to construct a westbound left turn at the westerly project driveway on Leisey Road.
  - 33.4 Subject to FDOT approval, the Developer shall be allowed to modify the existing access point on U.S. 41 from a right-in / right-out to a directional access.
  - 33.5 The Developer shall be allowed two access points on Leisey Road one full access and one right-in/right-out.
  - 33.6 All improvements shall be constructed to Hillsborough County or FDOT standards

# THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS SHALL APPLY TO THE PLANNED DEVELOPMENT AND SUBSEQUENT MODIFICATIONS:

- 34. Approval of this application does not ensure that water will be available at the time when the applicant seeks permits to actually develop.
  - 34.1 The stormwater management system shall be designed and constructed in such a manner so as to not adversely impact off-site surface and groundwater elevations.
- 35. Approval of this zoning petition by Hillsborough County does not constitute a guarantee that the Environmental Protection Commission approvals/permits necessary for the development as proposed will be issued, does not itself serve to justify any impact to wetlands, and does not grant any implied or vested right to environmental approvals.
- 36. The Development of the project shall proceed in strict accordance with the terms and conditions contained in the Development Order, the General Site Plan, the land use conditions contained herein, and all applicable rules, regulations, and ordinances of Hillsborough County.
- 37. Within 90 days of approval of PRS 13-0591 by the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners, the developer shall submit to the Planning and Growth Management Department a revised General Development Site Plan for certification reflecting all the conditions outlined above.

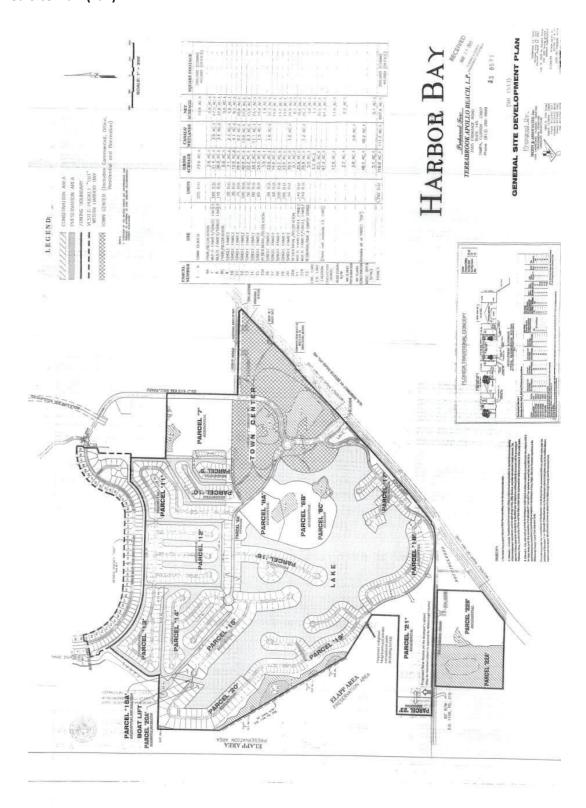

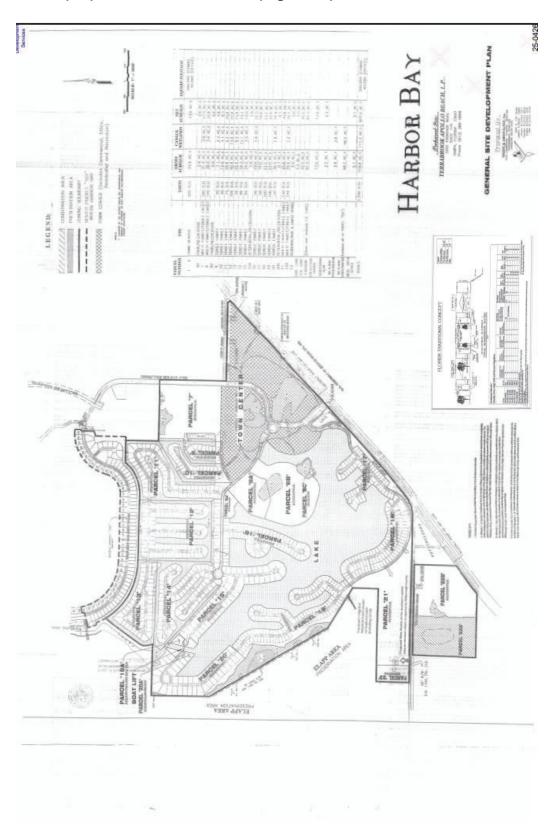

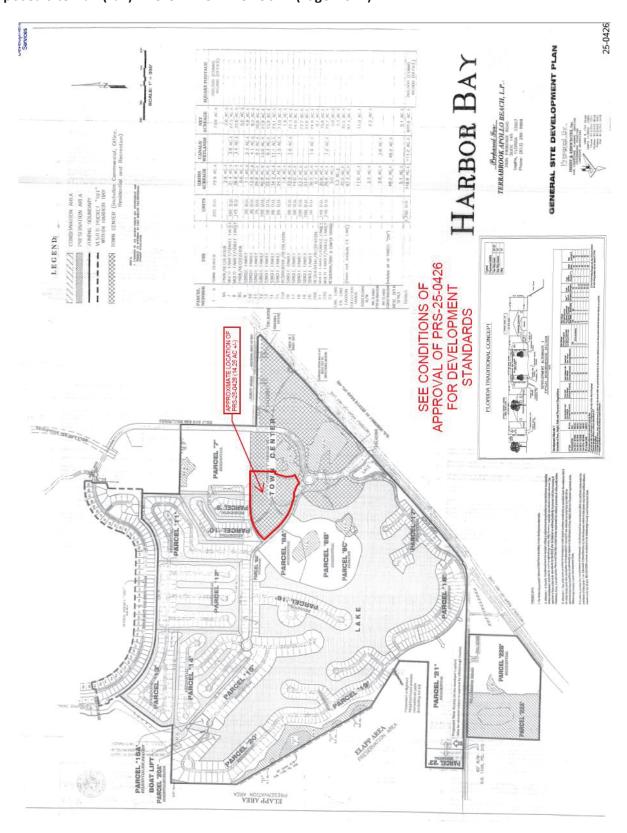

## **NEW AND REVISED CONDITIONS**

This agency objects for the reasons set forth below.

## Revised Conditions

- 9. Setbacks and other development standards for specific uses within each of the parcels shall be as indicated in Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan as attached, except as amended below.
  - 9.1 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received February 90, 2005 for PRS 05-0710, the minimum Front Yard setback for front-loading garages shall be 20 feet; and the minimum Front Yard setback for side—loading garages (garages in which the garage entrance does not face the street entrance to the lot) shall be 15 feet.
  - 9.2 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received April 17, 2025, for PRS 25-0426 which has been platted consistent with the Florida Traditional Development option for the Town Center, pursuant to that certain Plat of Townhomes at Compass Pointe recorded at Official Records Book 108, Page 217, (referred to as "Compass Point Plat"). Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan is amended to additionally include the following minimum setbacks and other development standards when developing single family detached uses on the subject platted lots:

## Front Setback:

3-feet Minimum (Principal Structure & Optional Porches)<sup>1</sup>

#### Rear Setback

Not Adjacent to an Alleyway: 3-feet Minimum (Principal Structure, Decks, Pools, Enclosures, Patios)

Adjacent to an Alleyway: 5-feet Minimum (Principal Structure, Garages Decks, Pools, Enclosures, Patios)<sup>2, 3</sup>

#### Side Setback:

5-feet Minimum (Principal Structure) 2,3

Not Adjacent to an Alleyway: 3-feet Minimum (Decks, Pools, Enclosures, Patios)

Adjacent to an Alleyway: 5-feet Minimum (Garages, Decks, Pools, Enclosures,

Patios) 2, 3

Maximum Height: 45 feet

Building Coverage: N/A

- <sup>3</sup> Where adjacent to an alleyway, the setback located adjacent to an alleyway (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat), only the following landscaping and improvements shall be installed (a) a grass strip and/or frangible landscaping materials less than 18-inches in height (e.g. no plantings over 18-inches tall, nor fences, walls, hedges, trees, or rocks shall be permitted within these areas), and (b) a driveway providing access to/from the home and the alleyway.
  - 9.2.1 Model Homes constructed in Block 105 may utilize the existing on-street parking spaces located on Anchor Line Drive to satisfy employee and visitor parking requirements per Sec. 6.11.62, Land Development Code.
  - 9.2.2 Parking (temporary or otherwise) shall not be permitted in the following locations:
    - Along the alleyways (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat); and
    - b. Within any individual driveway which serves a dwelling unit accessed via such alleyways (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat), where such driveway (measured from edge of alley pavement to face of façade) is less than 20 feet in length.

This condition shall not be construed as preventing the loading or unloading of vehicles within the modification area.

- 9.2.3 Streets and alleyways within the modification area shall be perpetually owned and maintained by a Homeowners Association or similar maintenance entity (i.e. no transfer of ownership or maintenance responsibility may be transferred to Hillsborough County) consistent with the Compass Point Plat and community governance documents.
- 9.2.4 Each dwelling unit shall have pedestrian access via a continuous sidewalk system which connects each unit to the sidewalk system along a roadway or common area within or adjacent to the modification area. Such sidewalk system may be gated; however, if gated such gates shall be available for the daily use of project residents and guests. Such pedestrian walkway shall be within a tract owned and maintained by a Homeowners Association or similar maintenance entity. Alternatively, where such pedestrian sidewalk system runs through an adjacent lot or lots, each lot owner shall be granted access easement(s) as necessary to ensure that each owner has access to the sidewalk system. All easements shall be recorded prior or concurrent with site/construction plan approval, or, if no such approval is necessary, prior to issuance of Certificates of Occupancy (temporary or otherwise) for each individual unit.
  - a. Dwellings located adjacent to the sidewalk system shall have an entrance with a sidewalk from the dwellings to the sidewalk system.
  - b. There shall be no sidewalks along the alleyway.
  - c. Yards fronting the sidewalk system shall be considered front yards. Yards facing alleyways shall be considered rear yards. Yards with two sides fronting an alleyway shall adhere to the same requirements as a rear yard facing an alleyway.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Where adjacent to an alleyway, the setback shall be measured from the edge of alley pavement to face of the facade. Alley pavement shall be a minimum of 18 feet in width.

The applicant is not seeking to change project entitlements as a part of this request. Site access to the PD is also not proposed to be modified. Rather, the applicant is seeking to allow for an alternative single-family development option under the Florida Traditional Development (FTD) standards. These proposals adjust certain setbacks and other standards, which will permit the developer to construct a single-family detached product on property previously platted for a multi-family attached product. Staff notes that, as shown in the aerial below, a significant portion of the infrastructure has already been approved and constructed (or is otherwise under construction) within the subject area.



Citizens have expressed concerns regarding the applicant's proposed changes, raising concerns which include:

- Potential danger of 3-foot limited rear setbacks in slowing emergency response times, creating unnecessary safety risks for residents;
- Adding stress to already strained roadways, increasing congestion in peak hours; and,
- Increased on-street parking will obstruct traffic flow, making it more dangerous for pedestrians.

Staff shared some of the same concerns expressed by citizens. After several calls/meeting/emails to discuss the project, staff and the developer have agreed to revised setbacks and additional conditions which address staff's concerns. Specifically, staff was concerned with the ability of narrower alleyways, which are providing primary access to several of the lots within the modification area, to providing sufficient visibility, backing distance and room to maneuver for passenger and emergency vehicles. Accordingly, the applicant agreed to a set of conditions which:

- Prohibits "on-street" parking along or within alleyways or the driveways serving individual units which are accessed via alleyways;
- Prohibits fencing, rocks, walls, or similar materials within the 5-foot rear and side yard setbacks that are adjacent to the alleyways, permitting only grass and other frangible landscaping materials under 18-inches in height within the area;
- Requires sidewalks to occur on a different side of the structure from the alleyways (where the reduced setbacks would create pedestrian safety concerns due to insufficient visibility/ backing distance between garages and sidewalks); and,
- Requires any units which permit parking within driveways accessed via the alleyway to have a driveway a minimum of 20-feet in length (to help prevent cars parking in the driveway from blocking the alleyway).

Regarding the other concerns, staff notes that the plat was previously approved for Townhomes. From a transportation perspective, pulling attached units apart to create a single-family product is not distinctly different (from an operational/geometric perspective) from an attached townhome product or 2-family duplex (such as the units constructed immediately to the east of the modification area). Staff notes that the overall density of the project remains unchanged, and no new entitlements are proposed. Also, restrictions agreed to by the applicant will provide significantly greater protections than the units constructed within the Town Center to the east. Each dwelling unit will provide minimum required parking (either within a driveway, subject to the above proposed restriction) and/or within a garage. Staff disagrees that property constructed on-street parking, which are constructed as parallel parking spaces, create safety or operational issues, and staff notes that on-street parking is a strategy/style permitted within the Transportation Technical Manual (TTM) and is a common or required component of projects built in a Traditional Neighborhood Development (TND) style. In fact, these projects can be inherently safer than the modern development styles commonly seen throughout the County, by separating pedestrians from motorists and thereby removing the conflict between traffic backing out of garages and across sidewalks.

Given the history of the existing zoning conditions/entitlements, fact that a similar style of development appears to have taken place within the project, and proposed modifications will further enhance safety and operational aspects of transportation infrastructure within the modification area (particularly compared to the existing conditions and adjacent development), staff recommends approval subject to the conditions proposed hereinabove.

Consistent with Sec. 6.2.1.C of the Development Review Procedures Manual (DRPM), the applicant was not required submit a trip generation and site access analysis given that there are no changes in project

entitlements or access. Staff has prepared the below comparison of residential trips generated within the "Town Center" portion of the development, within which the modification area is located, based on the existing and proposed zoning scenarios. Data show below is based on the 11<sup>th</sup> Edition of the Institute of Transportation Engineer's <u>Trip Generation Manual</u>.

Approval - Approval of the request, subject to the conditions listed below, is based on the general site plan submitted May 29, 2013.

- 1. The development of the project shall proceed in strict accordance with the terms and conditions contained in the Development Order for the DRI, the Site Plan, the zoning conditions contained herein, and all applicable rules, regulations and ordinances of Hillsborough County.
- 2. The maximum amount of each development type shall be as indicated on the Certified General Site Development Plan.
- 3. Each parcel within the site is permitted two development scenarios with the following permitted uses except as further conditioned elsewhere in these zoning conditions:
  - 3.1 Development of each of the parcels in a conventional parcel development configuration with conventional standards, buffers and screening as specified on the general site plan; OR,
  - 3.2 Development of each of the parcels in a Florida Traditional Development concept (FTD) configuration with uses as depicted on the general site plan and standards as specified in Alternate # 1 on the above referenced site plan, except as amended below.
- 4. Upon construction of a residential dwelling unit in a development parcel, a precedent is established for such parcel for either conventional parcel development or TND development and, therefore, only that type of development may be constructed in that development parcel. However, the developer shall have the option of modifying the size and dimensions of each pod including further pod division prior to approval of construction site plans. The developer shall be required to amend the certified general site plan to reflect modifications in pod sizes and dimensions. The developer shall be responsible for preparing and enforcing the parcels architectural control guidelines.

# THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY IF THE PROJECT IS DEVELOPED IN A CONVENTIONAL POD DEVELOPMENT

- 5. Land uses, setbacks, and other development standards within parcels designated "Town Center" (parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6) shall be restricted to those permitted within the C-G and B-PO and RMC-20 zoning district. The maximum FAR shall be 0.25. The maximum residential density shall be 20 dwelling units per acre.
- 6. Land uses, setbacks, and other development standards within parcels designated for multi-family shall be restricted to those permitted within the RMC-20 zoning district. The maximum density shall be 20 dwelling units per gross acre.

7. Land uses, setbacks, and other development standards within parcels designated single-family residential shall be restricted to those permitted within the RSC-9 zoning district. - 8. External access points shall be as indicated on the approved general site plan, subject to final approval by Hillsborough County and the Florida Department of Transportation.
  - 8.1 The conceptually located access proposed via Villemaire into parcel 21 is at the developer's option and if constructed, will be gated by a card reader or other device to control unauthorized access. The gate system is subject to review and approval by all applicable Hillsborough County emergency providers.
  - 8.2 All internal subdivision roads shall be maintained by the home owner association, the Community Development District, or a similar entity and shall not be the responsibility of the County.

- 9. Setbacks and other development standards for specific uses within each of the parcels shall be as indicated in Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan as attached, except as amended below.
  - 9.1 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received February 90, 2005 for PRS 05-0710, the minimum Front Yard setback for front-loading garages shall be 20 feet; and the minimum Front Yard setback for side—loading garages (garages in which the garage entrance does not face the street entrance to the lot) shall be 15 feet.
- 10. Each owner occupied dwelling unit is permitted one detached accessory dwelling unit on the same lot with standards as defined and regulated by the LDC. Because of their accessory nature, these units shall not be deducted from the overall number of units permitted for the project.
- 11. Sidewalks, a minimum of 4 feet wide, shall be required on both sides of the street.
- 12. Alleyways shall be permitted.
- 13. Land uses within the parcels designated "Town Center" (Parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6) shall be permitted to mix retail, office, recreational and residential uses as permitted within the C-G, B-PO, and RMC-20 zoning districts. Churches and other religious institutions, Child Care facilities, Adult Care facilities, Community meeting facilities, Community Residential Homes type A, B, and C, and individual craft or rural home industries employing no more than 5 employees each shall also be permitted without additional special use review. For purposes of determining size and bulk, the maximum FAR of the non-residential portion of any structure shall be 0.25 and the residential portion shall have a density of 20 dwellings per acre.

- 14. Land uses within parcels designated "Town Center" shall be of a unified design scheme exhibiting the following design criteria:
  - 14.1 Interconnected pedestrian system with the surrounding project.
  - 14.2 Provision of pedestrian facilities (i.e.: shade trees, tables, chairs, benches, trash receptacles).
  - 14.3 Other amenities including awnings and other outdoor overhead structures providing shade, public art, water features and drinking fountains.
  - 14.4 On-street parking is encouraged.
  - 14.5 There shall be no front yard setback.
  - 14.6 To the greatest extent possible, other than on-street parking, all additional parking shall be located in the rear yard of all structures.
  - 14.7 A mix of residential and non-residential development within the same structure is encouraged.
- 15. On street parking shall be permitted within each of the parcels and shall count as part of any required parking. The developer shall have the right to submit alternative parking plans and shared parking plans to satisfy required parking. Excessive parking spaces shall be discouraged.

## THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY REGARDLESS OF WHICH OPTION IS CHOSEN

- 16. Public and private recreational uses and public assembly uses including meeting halls, club houses, religious institutions, child day care centers, and lighted tot lots, ball fields and courts are specifically approved in any parcel designated for Town Center.
- 17. Private recreational uses shall be permitted within parcels 15 and 20 where adjacent to the boat lift and within parcel 8 at the location as indicated on the certified general site plan. Accessory pedestrian, bicycle, canoe, wind surfing, paddle boats, fishing, and nature walk facilities including restrooms and showers, bike racks, interpretive kiosks, snack bars, bait stands, and information centers, and necessary vehicular parking to serve such uses shall also be permitted within these areas. The location and size of such accessory facilities including the exact dimensions of recreational facility parcels shall be determined at Preliminary Plat or Site Plan approval for that parcel, with the exception that any proposed building shall be limited to a maximum of 600 square feet, and any related rental storage shall be limited to a height of 15 feet. No more than one facility shall be permitted on each parcel.
- 18. General office and permissible commercial uses shall be concentrated for maximum pedestrian convenience and located for easy accessibility by residents and workers.

19. The developer shall designate the "Preserve" protection area in accordance with the requirements contained within the companion DRI Development Order.

The open storage of boats, RV's and similar uses owned by the residents of the project is specifically permitted in parcel 23 provided this facility is completely screened from view by either a masonry wall or opaque fence six feet in height and adequately maintained by the developer or its assigns. If such group can no longer or is unwilling to assume maintenance responsibilities, the private open storage area may be redeveloped with uses and lots similar to the adjacent residential development pattern provided there is no additional residential units beyond those previously approved.
- 21. Boat lifts, in accordance with and in the general location as indicated on the general site plan shall be permitted subject to approval by all applicable agencies. Approval of this zoning petition in no way warrants approval of the boat lift or resultant boat traffic by other agencies.
- 22. The large interior lake (AKA Lagoon), in accordance with and in the general location as indicated on the general site plan submitted on September 8, 2000 shall be permitted subject to approval by all applicable agencies. Approval of this zoning petition in no way warrants approval of the size, dimensions, or use of the lagoon or potential boat traffic by other agencies.
- 23. A sales center shall be permitted in any parcel designated for Town Center (parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6).
- 24. Accessory structures not limited to decks, docks, pools and patios shall be allowed with a 3' side and rear setback, except canal lots which shall have a 0' rear yard setback.
- 25. Single family uses may be permitted within any multi-family parcel to the extent that the total number of units do not exceed the maximum permitted by the DRI.
- 26. An interim agricultural use of cattle grazing, citrus groves, and other low scale agricultural uses shall be permitted. This agricultural operation shall not result in the destruction of the natural plant community vegetation on the property. Any application to conduct land alteration activities on the property must be submitted to the Natural Resources Team of the Planning and Growth Management Department for review and approval. Use of the agricultural exemption provision to the Land Alteration regulations is prohibited.
- 27. The developer shall prepare and submit a sea grass protection plan including all related local commitments to the Hillsborough County Environmental Protection Commission as part of required local approvals and environmental permitting.

28. The developer may provide parks in the locations as generally depicted on the approved General Development Site Plan and/or within any parcel designated for Town Center (Parcels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6). These parks shall be maintained and be the perpetual responsibility of the developer or subsequent homeowner group or other similar association. If neither group can no longer or is unwilling to assume maintenance responsibilities, the park(s) may be redeveloped with uses and lots similar to the adjacent residential development pattern provided there are no additional residential units beyond those previously approved.

- 29. To promote connectivity and to ensure completion of the extension of Golf and Sea Boulevard, the developer shall use best efforts with the assistance and support of Hillsborough County to design and commence construction to county standards, and dedicate to the county the applicable Golf and Sea Boulevard extension prior to or commensurate with 400 dwelling units of residential development. The completion of this segment shall occur within one year of the commencement date. No additional permits shall be issued after the completion date without completion of the road.
- 30. The developer shall be permitted to transfer dwelling units between parcels designated for such use subject to no increase in the overall number of units approved for the project. The developer shall be required to submit a revised general site plan for certification to reflect any change/transfer in dwelling units between pods.
- 31. As part of any approval of Parcel 22, the developer shall provide an acceptable access via Villemaire Road to the project for Sheriff and Fire Departments access for purposes of safety, and for the County Parks Dept for purposes of maintenance of adjacent County owned ELAP lands.
- 32. Prior to Preliminary site plan approval for parcel (Parcel 22), the developer shall provide a traffic analysis signed by a Professional Engineer, showing the length of the left turn lane required to serve the project's traffic. The developer shall construct, at their expense, a westbound left turn lane at the projects driveway. The improvement shall be constructed to Hillsborough County standards.
- 33. Prior to issuance of Certificates of Occupancy for development with Development Parcels 1 through 6:
  - 33.1 The applicant shall be required to construct right turn lanes at each project driveway on US Highway 41 and a left turn lane at the directional median southern access on US Highway 41.
  - The applicant shall be required to dedicate additional right of way for the future road widening as determined by FDOT. Additional right of way may also be required to construct the right turn lanes on US Highway 41 as also determined by FDOT.
  - 33.3 The applicant shall be required to construct a westbound left turn at the westerly project driveway on Leisey Road.

- 33.6 All improvements shall be constructed to Hillsborough County or FDOT standards

## THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS SHALL APPLY TO THE PLANNED DEVELOPMENT AND SUBSEQUENT MODIFICATIONS:

- 34. Approval of this application does not ensure that water will be available at the time when the applicant seeks permits to actually develop.
  - 34.1 The stormwater management system shall be designed and constructed in such a manner so as to not adversely impact off-site surface and groundwater elevations.
- 35. Approval of this zoning petition by Hillsborough County does not constitute a guarantee that the Environmental Protection Commission approvals/permits necessary for the development as proposed will be issued, does not itself serve to justify any impact to wetlands, and does not grant any implied or vested right to environmental approvals.
- 36. The Development of the project shall proceed in strict accordance with the terms and conditions contained in the Development Order, the General Site Plan, the land use conditions contained herein, and all applicable rules, regulations, and ordinances of Hillsborough County.
- 37. Within 90 days of approval of PRS 13-0591 by the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners, the developer shall submit to the Planning and Growth Management Department a revised General Development Site Plan for certification reflecting all the conditions outlined above.

This agency objects for the reasons set forth below.

#### Revised Conditions

- 9. Setbacks and other development standards for specific uses within each of the parcels shall be as indicated in Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan as attached, except as amended below.
  - 9.1 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received February 90, 2005 for PRS 05-0710, the minimum Front Yard setback for front-loading garages shall be 20 feet; and the minimum Front Yard setback for side—loading garages (garages in which the garage entrance does not face the street entrance to the lot) shall be 15 feet.
  - 9.2 Within Mirabay, part of the Harbor Bay Planned Development as shown on the general site plan received April 17, 2025, for PRS 25-0426 which has been platted consistent with the Florida Traditional Development option for the Town Center, pursuant to that certain Plat of Townhomes at Compass Pointe recorded at Official Records Book 108, Page 217, (referred to as "Compass Point Plat"). Alternate #1 on the General Site Development Plan is amended to additionally include the following minimum setbacks and other development standards when developing single family detached uses on the subject platted lots:

#### Front Setback:

3-feet Minimum (Principal Structure & Optional Porches)<sup>1</sup>

#### Rear Setback

Not Adjacent to an Alleyway: 3-feet Minimum (Principal Structure, Decks, Pools, Enclosures, Patios)

Adjacent to an Alleyway: 5-feet Minimum (Principal Structure, Garages Decks, Pools, Enclosures, Patios)<sup>2, 3</sup>

#### Side Setback:

5-feet Minimum (Principal Structure) 2,3

Not Adjacent to an Alleyway: 3-feet Minimum (Decks, Pools, Enclosures, Patios)

Adjacent to an Alleyway: 5-feet Minimum (Garages, Decks, Pools, Enclosures,

Patios) 2, 3

Maximum Height: 45 feet

Building Coverage: N/A

- <sup>3</sup> Where adjacent to an alleyway, the setback located adjacent to an alleyway (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat), only the following landscaping and improvements shall be installed (a) a grass strip and/or frangible landscaping materials less than 18-inches in height (e.g. no plantings over 18-inches tall, nor fences, walls, hedges, trees, or rocks shall be permitted within these areas), and (b) a driveway providing access to/from the home and the alleyway.
  - 9.2.1 Model Homes constructed in Block 105 may utilize the existing on-street parking spaces located on Anchor Line Drive to satisfy employee and visitor parking requirements per Sec. 6.11.62, Land Development Code.
  - 9.2.2 Parking (temporary or otherwise) shall not be permitted in the following locations:
    - Along the alleyways (labeled as "Private Driveways" on the Compass Pointe Plat); and

This condition shall not be construed as preventing the loading or unloading of vehicles within the modification area.

- 9.2.3 Streets and alleyways within the modification area shall be perpetually owned and maintained by a Homeowners Association or similar maintenance entity (i.e. no transfer of ownership or maintenance responsibility may be transferred to Hillsborough County) consistent with the Compass Point Plat and community governance documents.
- 9.2.4 Each dwelling unit shall have pedestrian access via a continuous sidewalk system which connects each unit to the sidewalk system along a roadway or common area within or adjacent to the modification area. Such sidewalk system may be gated; however, if gated such gates shall be available for the daily use of project residents and guests. Such pedestrian walkway shall be within a tract owned and maintained by a Homeowners Association or similar maintenance entity. Alternatively, where such pedestrian sidewalk system runs through an adjacent lot or lots, each lot owner shall be granted access easement(s) as necessary to ensure that each owner has access to the sidewalk system. All easements shall be recorded prior or concurrent with site/construction plan approval, or, if no such approval is necessary, prior to issuance of Certificates of Occupancy (temporary or otherwise) for each individual unit.
  - a. Dwellings located adjacent to the sidewalk system shall have an entrance with a sidewalk from the dwellings to the sidewalk system.
  - b. There shall be no sidewalks along the alleyway.
  - c. Yards fronting the sidewalk system shall be considered front yards. Yards facing alleyways shall be considered rear yards. Yards with two sides fronting an alleyway shall adhere to the same requirements as a rear yard facing an alleyway.

The applicant is not seeking to change project entitlements as a part of this request. Site access to the PD is also not proposed to be modified. Rather, the applicant is seeking to allow for an alternative single-family development option under the Florida Traditional Development (FTD) standards. These proposals adjust certain setbacks and other standards, which will permit the developer to construct a single-family detached product on property previously platted for a multi-family attached product. Staff notes that, as shown in the aerial below, a significant portion of the infrastructure has already been approved and constructed (or is otherwise under construction) within the subject area.



Citizens have expressed concerns regarding the applicant's proposed changes, raising concerns which include:

- Potential danger of 3-foot limited rear setbacks in slowing emergency response times, creating unnecessary safety risks for residents;
- Adding stress to already strained roadways, increasing congestion in peak hours; and,
- Increased on-street parking will obstruct traffic flow, making it more dangerous for pedestrians.

Staff shared some of the same concerns expressed by citizens. After several calls/meeting/emails to discuss the project, staff and the developer have agreed to revised setbacks and additional conditions which address staff's concerns. Specifically, staff was concerned with the ability of narrower alleyways, which are providing primary access to several of the lots within the modification area, to providing sufficient visibility, backing distance and room to maneuver for passenger and emergency vehicles. Accordingly, the applicant agreed to a set of conditions which:

- Prohibits "on-street" parking along or within alleyways or the driveways serving individual units which are accessed via alleyways;
- Prohibits fencing, rocks, walls, or similar materials within the 5-foot rear and side yard setbacks that are adjacent to the alleyways, permitting only grass and other frangible landscaping materials under 18-inches in height within the area;
- Requires sidewalks to occur on a different side of the structure from the alleyways (where the reduced setbacks would create pedestrian safety concerns due to insufficient visibility/ backing distance between garages and sidewalks); and,
- Requires any units which permit parking within driveways accessed via the alleyway to have a driveway a minimum of 20-feet in length (to help prevent cars parking in the driveway from blocking the alleyway).

Regarding the other concerns, staff notes that the plat was previously approved for Townhomes. From a transportation perspective, pulling attached units apart to create a single-family product is not distinctly different (from an operational/geometric perspective) from an attached townhome product or 2-family duplex (such as the units constructed immediately to the east of the modification area). Staff notes that the overall density of the project remains unchanged, and no new entitlements are proposed. Also, restrictions agreed to by the applicant will provide significantly greater protections than the units constructed within the Town Center to the east. Each dwelling unit will provide minimum required parking (either within a driveway, subject to the above proposed restriction) and/or within a garage. Staff disagrees that property constructed on-street parking, which are constructed as parallel parking spaces, create safety or operational issues, and staff notes that on-street parking is a strategy/style permitted within the Transportation Technical Manual (TTM) and is a common or required component of projects built in a Traditional Neighborhood Development (TND) style. In fact, these projects can be inherently safer than the modern development styles commonly seen throughout the County, by separating pedestrians from motorists and thereby removing the conflict between traffic backing out of garages and across sidewalks.

Given the history of the existing zoning conditions/entitlements, fact that a similar style of development appears to have taken place within the project, and proposed modifications will further enhance safety and operational aspects of transportation infrastructure within the modification area (particularly compared to the existing conditions and adjacent development), staff recommends approval subject to the conditions proposed hereinabove.

Consistent with Sec. 6.2.1.C of the Development Review Procedures Manual (DRPM), the applicant was not required submit a trip generation and site access analysis given that there are no changes in project

entitlements or access. Staff has prepared the below comparison of residential trips generated within the "Town Center" portion of the development, within which the modification area is located, based on the existing and proposed zoning scenarios. Data show below is based on the 11<sup>th</sup> Edition of the Institute of Transportation Engineer's <u>Trip Generation Manual</u>.

**Good Morning** 

I am writing/speaking from **Experience** of a zoning change that was made at a previous residence of mine. In the town where I lived the zoning board gave a RIGHT of way of 60 feet vs the 200 feet in AAA zoning to my newer next-door neighbor building lot. This person's driveway was at a higher level and we had a storm and much gravel and intense water washed **into and across** the public road and filled up the BASEMENT of the one home across the public road. This caused 5 feet of water to enter the garage and fill the finished basement with wall-to-wall rugs and oak flooring home and It was like having an inground pool inside the home. The furnace and water pump had to have new bearings because they were ruined being submerged in water. A firetruck had to come and pump them out.

BECAUSE the water and soil erosion crossed the town road and it had (No buffers, curbing or drainage pipe lines were installed opposite the upward driveway) The neighbors that were flooded-their insurance company **SUED the town and the TOWN** had to pay the nearly 30,000.00 damages for just one home. This was 25 years ago. (So these days the price tag will be much greater with many more dense properties if allowed) They later put in culverts & curbing, to prevent a repeat of the damages. THEN

Two or three years later a builder wanted to have a variance in the zoning on an abutting road changed to 100 feet from 200 feet (MORE denseness at the towns expense and) *only for his additional profit*. He wanted 20 dwellings vs 10 that were already approved.

Myself and 4 other abutting neighbors were invited to speak at the zoning meeting. This including the next door neighbor, the one that had the driveway wash down and caused the damage to the other neighbors home and driveway.

I was allowed to speak and I reminded them that they already paid out a good deal of unnecessary town money for allowing a more dense building.

The zoning board quickly voted to leave the original approval as proposed not to allow additional homes.

If the town had allowed that change it would have made the housing and driveways more dense and again, when the water crossed the road its the towns responsibility, if they allow a varience.

If you want I can give you the current zoning contact information to verify that the damages were paid out. Since both elderly neighbors have since moved away they would not be able to verify, but I am sure the town has a record of the variance and the rejected variance on record.

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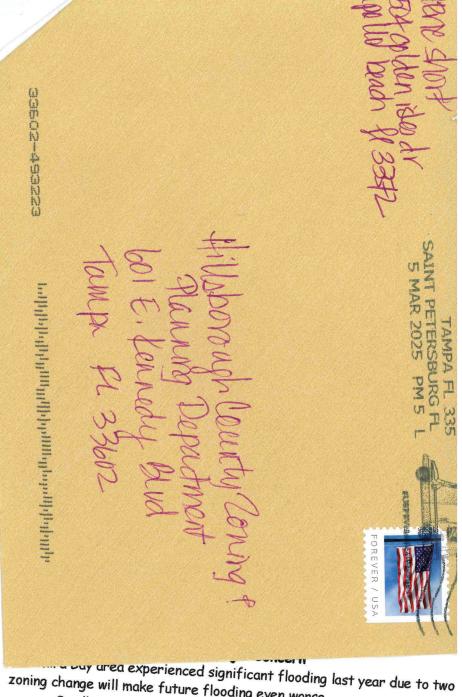

We are writing regarding proposed modifications to PD-98-513. While we support the applicant's request to change 84 platted townhome lots into single-family detached homes to align with the residential character of our community, we strongly oppose the proposed reduction in setbacks to as little as 5 feet for front and rear yards and 3 feet for pools, patios and enclosures.

With virtually no land left for storm water absorption, we have significant concerns about the exacerbation of existing flooding issues as well as other concerns including increased fire hazards, infrastructure strain and negative impact on property values. We think the proposed community should be adding a retention pond given how much they've elevated the ground already, not requesting less opportunity for water runoff.

I am writing on behalf of concerned homeowners in the Mira Bay community regarding the proposed modification to PD-98-1513. We recognize and support the applicant's request to change 84 platted townhome lots into single-family detached homes, as this aligns with the residential character of our community.

However, we strongly oppose the proposed reduction in setbacks to as little as 5 feet for front and rear yards and 3 feet for pools, patios, and enclosures. This change is detrimental to our neighborhood and will exacerbate existing flooding issues, increase fire hazards, strain infrastructure, and negatively impact property values.

#### 1. Increased Flooding Risks—A Major Concern

The Mira Bay area experienced significant flooding last year due to two hurricanes, and this proposed zoning change will make future flooding even worse.

- Smaller setbacks mean more impermeable surface area (more buildings, less green space), which reduces the land's ability to absorb rainwater.
- More water runoff = more flooding—our stormwater infrastructure was not designed to handle this level of density.
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- If approved, this zoning change could also raise flood insurance costs for existing homeowners.
- Hillsborough County should not approve a modification that makes an already flood-prone area even more vulnerable.

# 2. Community Character & Property Value Decline

- The existing zoning setbacks (15-25 feet) are in place to maintain an open, high-quality residential environment.

- Reducing side setbacks to 5 feet increases the risk of fire spreading between homes.
