Staff's Recommended Board Motion:

Approve the attached resolution and covenant granting an historic preservation property tax exemption for a 10-year period for improvements made to the commercial building located at 1302 E. 7th Avenue in the Ybor City Historic District (Folio 197336.0000).

Financial Impact Statement:

The estimated FY 21 loss of ad valorem tax revenue will be approximately \$25,156.80.

Background:

The attached tax exemption application has been submitted by the City of Tampa Barrio Latino Commission pursuant to Hillsborough County's Historic Property Tax Exemption Ordinance (#93-7), as amended (Sec. 46-66 et seq., Hillsborough County Code of Ordinances). This Ordinance (attached) provides an exemption from Hillsborough County ad valorem taxes to owners of historic properties that have completed rehabilitation or renovation projects that meet approved guidelines. The exemption is for 100% of the assessed value of the historically significant improvements and is for a 10-year period beginning on January 1st of the year following the substantial completion of the improvements. In the subject case, the project completion date reported by the property owner is November 16, 2020. Therefore, the tax exemption will be for the period beginning January 1, 2021, and ending December 31, 2030. The taxable value of the improvements will be determined by the Property Appraiser.

If the taxable value of the historically significant improvements to the building is the estimated cost (\$4,000,000) reported on Page 1, Section 3, Part II – Post Rehabilitation, City of Tampa Historic Property Ad Valorem Tax Exemption Application, the estimated FY 21 loss of ad valorem tax revenue will be:

Countywide \$ 22,923.60 <u>Library</u> \$ 2,233.20 Total \$ 25,156.80

As the local reviewing entity designated to certify that the project meets the requirements of the tax abatement ordinance, the Barrio Latino Commission reviewed the application and found that it meets the criteria of the ordinance as stated in the attached resolution. According to the tax exemption application, an estimated total of \$7,500,000 was expended in the restoration of the commercial building, constructed circa 1893, of which \$4,000,000 was spent on historically significant improvements.

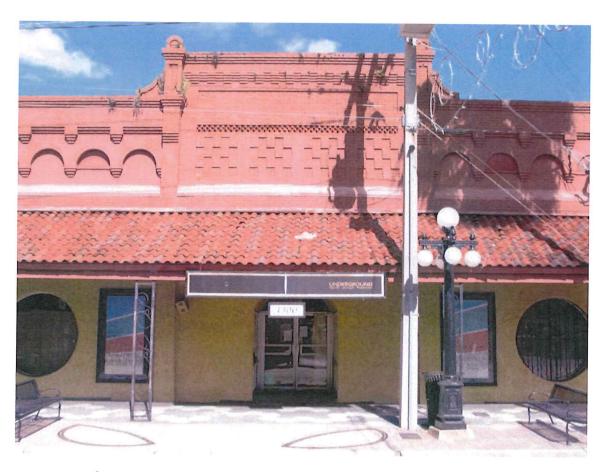

If the Property is damaged by accidental or natural causes during the Covenant period, the Owner will inform, the () Division of Historical Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office in writing of the damage to the Property, including (1) an assessment of the nature and extent of the damage; and (2) an estimate of the cost of restoration or reconstruction work necessary to return the Property to the condition existing at the time of project completion. In order to maintain the tax exemption, the Owner shall complete the restoration or reconstruction work necessary to return the Property to the condition existing at the time of project completion on a time schedule agreed upon by the Owner and the () Division of Historical Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office.
- 7. If the Property has been destroyed or severely damaged by accidental or natural causes, that is, if the historical integrity of the features, materials, appearance, workmanship, and environment, or archaeological integrity which made the property eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places or designation under the terms of the local preservation ordinance have been lost or so damaged that restoration is not feasible, the Owner will notify the () Division of Historical Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office in writing of the loss. The ()Division of Historical Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office will evaluate the information provided and notify the Owner in writing of its determination regarding removal of the Property from eligibility for tax exemption. If the () Division of Historical

Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office determines that the property should be removed from eligibility for tax exemption, it will notify the Property Appraiser of the county in which the Property is located in writing so that the tax exemption can be cancelled for the remainder of the Covenant period. In such cases, no penalty or interest shall be assessed against the Owner.

- 8. If it appears that the historical integrity, of the features, materials, appearance, workmanship, and environment, or archaeological integrity which made the Property eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places or designation under the terms of the local preservation ordinance have been lost or damaged deliberately or through gross neglect of the Owner, the () Division of Historical Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office shall notify the Owner in writing. For the purpose of this Covenant "gross negligence" means the omission of care which even inattentive and thoughtless persons never fail to take care of their own property. The Owner shall have 30 days to respond indicating any circumstances which show that the damage was not deliberate or due to gross negligence. If the Owner cannot show such circumstances, he shall develop a plan for restoration of the Property and a schedule for completion of the restoration. In order to maintain the tax exemption, the Owner shall complete the restoration work necessary to return the Property to the condition existing at the time of the project completion on a time schedule agreed upon by the Owner and the () Division of Historical Resources (X) Local Historic Preservation Office. If the Owner does not complete the restoration work on the agreed upon time schedule, the () Division of Historical Resources X) Local Historic Preservation Office will report such violation to the Property Appraiser and Tax Collector who shall take action pursuant to 196.1997 (7), Florida Statutes. The Barrio Latino Commission (BLC) reviewed the referenced ad Valorem Tax Exemption Application at its meeting of January 26, 2021. Through exhibits and testimony, the applicant demonstrated that the original features of the structure were preserved and that modifications to the property are compatible with its historic character. DIVISION 4. - HISTORIC PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

Sec. 46-66. - Intent and purpose.

It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners of Hillsborough County to promote ad valorem lax exemptions for historic properties which meet the criteria of this division and, in so doing, foster the preservation and renovation of historic properties in the County to enhance the quality of life for all citizens of the County.

Sec. 46-67. - Title.

This division shall be known as the "Historic Property Tax Exemption Ordinance,"

Sec. 46-68. - Property eligible for tax exemption.

- The following properties in Hillshorough County are qualified to be considered for ad valorom tax exemplion:
 - Property Individually listed in the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966;
 - (2) A contributing property to a National Register fisted district; or
 - Property designated as a historic property, or as a contributing property to a historic district, by the historic preservation regulations found in the County's historic preservation regulations, or in the historic preservation regulations of any municipality in the Gounty.
- The local historic preservation office in the jurisdiction of the local government shall certify to the Board of County Commissioners that the property for which an exemption is requested satisfies Subsection (a) of this section.

Sec. 46-69. - Procedure of granting tax exemption.

- (a) Any person, firm or corporation that desires an ad valorem lox exemption must file an application with the Board of County Commissioners and include the following information:
 - (1) The name of the property owner and the location of the historic property.
 - If the exemption requested is for an improvement to property, a description of the improvements to real property for which an examption is requested and the dates of commencement and completion of construction of such improvements.
 - (3) Proof, to the satisfaction of the local historic preservation office that the property that is to be rehabilitated or renovated is a historio property.
 - (4) Proof, to the satisfaction of the local historic preservation office that the improvements to the properly will be consistent with the United States Secretary of Interior's Standards for

Rehabilitation and will be made in accordance with guidelines developed by the Department of

- (5) Other Information deemed necessary by the Department of State.
- The Board of County Commissioners shall deliver a copy of each application for a historic preservation ad valorem tax exemption to the Property Appraiser of the County. Upon certification of the assessment roll or recertification, if applicable, pursuant to F.S. § 193,122, for each itseat year during which this division is in effect, the property appraiser shall report the following information to the local governing body:
 - (1) The lotal laxable value of all property within the County or municipality for the current flecal year.
 - The total exempted value of all property in the County or municipality which has been approved to raceive historic preservation ad valorem tex exemption for the current fiscal year.
- The local historic preservation office shall review the application for lax exemption and provide to the Board of County Commissioners a written recommendation of either approval or denial of the application. The review by the local historic preservation office must be conducted in accordance with rules adopted by the Department of State. The recommendation and reasons for the recommendation must be provided to the applicant and the Board of County Commissioners prior to the decision of the Board of County Commissioners.
- In order for an improvement to a historic property to qualify the property for an exemption, the improvement must:
 - (1) Be consistent with the United States Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation.
 - Be determined by the local historic preservation office to meet criteria established by the Department of State.
- The Board of County Commissioners may approve an application for lax exemption by resolution. Such exemption shall take effect on the January 1 following substantial completion of the improvement. The resolution approving the tax exemption shall contain:
 - The name of the owner and the address of the historic property for which the exemption is
 - The pellod of time for which the exemption will remain in affect and the expiration date of the exemption.
 - A finding that the historic property meets the requirements of this section. .
 - A resolution approving or denying the lax exemption shall not be directive until 15 days after the Board of County Commissioners' action. Within ten days of the Board of County Commissioners' action, the applicant may make a willen request to the County approval or denial of the lax exemption, the applicant may make a willen request to the County Administrator for the scheduling of a public hearing to address the tax exemption. Holice of the public hearing shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in Hillsborough County at least seven days prior to the hearing.
- To qualify for an exemption, the property owner must enter into a covenant or agreement with the o quality for the lemi for which the exemption is granted. The form of the coverant or agreement governing body for the term for which the exemption is granted. The form of the coverant or agreement must be established by the Depailment of State and must require that the character of the property, and the qualitying improvements to the property, be maintained during the period that the exemption is granted. The covenant or agreement shall be binding on the current properly owner, transferees, and lihely helrs, successors, or assigns. Violation of the coverant or agreement results in the property owner being subject to the payment of the differences between the total amount of taxes which would have been due in March in each of the previous years in which the covenant or agreement was in effect had the property not received the exemption and the total amount of taxes actually paid in those years, plus Interest on the difference calculated as provided in F.S. § 212.12(3).

Sec. 46-70. - Ad valorem tax exemptions for improvements to historic property.

The Board of County Commissioners may authorize the exemption from ad valorem taxallon of up to 100 percent of the assessed value of all improvements to historic properties which result from the restoration, renovallon or rehabilitation of such properties. The exemption applies only to improvements to real property. In order for the property to quality for the exemption, any such improvements must be made on or after the day this division is adopted (October 28, 1998).

Sec. 46-71. - Ad valorem tax exemptions for historic properties open to the public.

If an improvement qualifies a historic property for an exemption under Section 46-68 and the property is used for nonprofit or governmental, purposes and is regularly and frequently open for the public's visitation, use and benefit, the Board of County Commissioners or the governing authority of the municipality by ordinance may authorize the exemption from advalorem textulon of up to 100 percent of the assessed value of the property, so improved, if all other provisions of that section are compiled with; provided, however, that the assessed value of the improvement must be equal to at least 50 percent of the total however, that the assessed value of the improvement must be equal to at least 50 percent of the total improvements are made by or for the use of the existing owner, in order for the property to qualify for the exemption provided in this section, any such improvements must be made on or after the day the ordinance granting the examption is adopted.

Sec. 46.72. - Applicable taxes.

The lax exemplions allowed herein are only ad valorem taxes assessed by Hillsborough County. The exemplions do not apply to taxes leyled for the payment of bonds or to taxes authorized by a vote of the electors pursuant to Section 9(b) or Section 2, Article VII of the Florkia Constitution.

Sec. 46-73, - Duration of tax exemption.

Any tax exemption granted by this division shall remain in effect for up to ten years regardless of any change in the authority of the County to grant such exemptions or any change in the ownership of the property. Improvements which qualified the property for an exemption must be maintained over the period for which the exemption is granted.

Sec. 46-74. - Severability.

It is the legislative intent of the Board of County Commissioners in adopting this division that all provisions hereof shall be liberally construed to protect and preserve the peace, health, safety, and general welfere of the inhabitants of the portion of Hillsborough County. It is the turther intent of the Board of County velfere of the Inhabitants of the portion of Hillsborough County to the invalidity of any section, phrase, sentence, or other pair hereof, and that should any part of this division be held to the unconstitutions) or invalid by a count of compotent jurisdiction, such part shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent part, and such holding shall not be construed as alfeoting the validity of any of the remaining parts.
